As summer vacations come to a close, it is now time to start thinking about all the wonderful opportunities afforded students at WRHS. As you make final plans to return to school, Monday, August 24th, please review all the important information provided on our website and in the newsletter. Summer assignments are available on the website and should be completed according to the timeline provided by teachers. Students scheduled in Honors or Advanced Placement courses please make sure work is completed to be successful on the first day of classes. If you do not see your classes listed, there are no summer assignments to be submitted. WRHS will always provide an environment of rigor and relevant curriculum, offering 21 Advanced Placement courses, many on campus PHSC Dual Enrollment courses for college credit, plus numerous industry certifications for students in our Information Technology Academy, Culinary Arts program, and our Academy of Medical Professionals. WRHS has a 21st century approach to learning - be prepared to use technology every day. Students have access to WIFI, use of their own laptops and mobile devices including I-Pods, smart phones, I-Pads and other tablets. Text messaging, email, Twitter and Facebook are services we provide parents and students with important updates to events at the school. Many textbooks are available on-line and provide tutorial help with assignments. With the use of technology come responsibilities to our students to prevent loss or theft. Students should always secure valuables and do not leave them unsecured.

Because of the many successes of WRHS and the growth in our community, we are overcrowded and have important procedures to help make our school a safe and quality school experience for all students, parents and staff. Please review this information as we provide this information on our website, newsletter, orientation days and through messages sent by text, email or telephone. Traffic in the morning is always busy. With 40 buses arriving, 500 student drivers, 200 employees and hundreds of parents driving students to school, you **must** arrive early to prevent being late to school. Entering the campus after 7:15 am may lead to students arriving late to class impacting the quality of learning for everyone. Always follow the posted speed limits of 15 MPH at the entrance and 5 MPH in the parking lot areas. Entrance to the school is only accessible through the front entrance and everyone will exit through the service road by JLMS. This pattern will be followed in the morning and in the afternoon. In addition, the gates on the service road will be closed to traffic from 7:45 am to 1:00 pm. Everyone's safety is our number one priority. Arrive EARLY!

The start of the new school year brings with it both excitement and expectations. Please make sure you are familiar with the high school dress code as you make purchases prior to the start of school. Review with your child the attendance policy, tardy policy, and code of conduct information. All this information is available in the Student Planner that every child will receive the first week of school, or visit our website for information.

Student Parking

Attention Students and Parents:

Student parking applications for the upcoming 2015-2016 school year will be available on the WRHS website, and in the Student Services office starting on Monday, August 10th.

To purchase a parking permit, for the 2015-2016 school year, a student must meet the following requirements:

- Have a valid driver's license and proof of insurance
- Show Proof of Residency within the boundaries of the school using one of the following (the address listed must match the address on the student's driver's license):
 - a. Copy of a utility bill
 - b. Copy of a properly executed lease agreement
 - c. Copy of a mortgage statement
 - d. Copy of an affidavit of residence
- Be cleared of all school obligations from the previous school year(s)
- 4. Have an unweighted 2.0 GPA
- 5. Meet district attendance requirements

Spaces are limited, and will be sold on a first come, first serve basis. It is the expectation that at the time of purchase, students have the documents/requirements listed above. Parking permits will not be sold if these requirements are not met.

Seniors will be able to purchase a parking space at Senior Orientation on August 17th from 5-7pm. Parking permits will be on sale for juniors, and seniors, on Orientation Day, August 18th from 8-12pm. Sophomores will be able to buy a parking space during the first week of school. The cost is \$15.

*Students who purchase a parking permit are expected to sign-up and attend the Safe Behind the Wheel driver safety course, with Corporal Justice, within the first month of school. Dates and times for this course will be announced and posted. Failure to attend this free course will result in a student's driving privilege being revoked.

NOTICE TO BUILDING OCCUPANTS AND PARENTS

NOTIFICATION OF INSPECTION FOR ASBESTOS CONTAINING MATERIALS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers.

All inspections for Wiregrass Ranch High School (WRHS) have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspection, where applicable, has been submitted to the governor for approval. A copy of this plan is located in the administrative office of this school and at the Pasco County Schools Maintenance & Facility Services Department and is available for review upon request.
