FCAT 2.0 Reading Retakes

FCAT, Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test, retakes will be administered March 25^{TH} through April 10^{TH} . These test dates are for juniors and seniors who have moved to Florida and have not taken the FCAT, juniors and seniors who have not passed FCAT, and retained sophomores who have not passed FCAT. All students who are scheduled for FCAT retakes will receive testing information, including precise dates and locations, from their teachers. Students are encouraged to get a good night's rest and eat breakfast before coming to school on testing days.

Dress Code Reminder

Parents and students, as warm weather returns, please make sure that you review the dress code policy found in your planner. As a reminder: tank tops, halter tops, or clothing with thin straps (smaller than 3 inches) are not permissible; hats, bandannas, head coverings are not permitted on campus; low cut blouses are not allowed; sleeveless apparel is not allowed for boys; shorts and skirts should be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee; tops and shirts must be long enough to remain tucked inside pants or skirts; pants must be worn appropriately.

Students that are in violation of the dress code will be given consequences based on the student Code of Conduct.


