Our exam schedule is posted on the website along with other December state required testing. All students take semester exams. For honors and AP classes, the semester exams represent 15% of the semester grade. This is important for all college bound students regardless of grade level. Semester grades are the reporting grades provided to colleges and universities. For the class of 2015, this semester grade will be the final grade calculated for class ranking. In addition, class of 2015 college bound students should follow the timeline related to requesting transcripts from Student Services. Transcript requests must be submitted by December 12th to be processed before winter break.

Finally, the WRHS ABC (Assist, Believe, Care) program is open to help needy families in our community. Our school provided food and gifts to five needy families during the Thanksgiving holiday. Mentors Needed

Wiregrass Ranch High School has been working non-stop to create and provide interventions to a population of our school that needs urgent attention. These are the students that are silent, not motivated and that feel that life has pushed them aside. Many of them have no discipline issues at all, but are failing classes. As the holidays approach, I would like to call on the school community to offer their help in volunteering for a one on one mentoring program. We are looking for adults who can serve as role models and who will commit to working with a student to motivate, challenge and inspire the student to do his/her best. Many of these kids have no one that they feel they can really trust in their lives. We are looking for mentors to serve as trustworthy people in these students' lives. Unfortunately, a lot of these kids have issues outside of academics. They need to come to school and feel comfortable. They need someone that is going to believe in them. Can it be you? Our hope is that mentors will assist these students in setting some life goals: finding a part time job or getting a driver's license. A lot of these kids have never set goals for themselves. Having an adult show interest in them will hopefully get these kids motivated, which will help increase their success at school.

In addition to mentors, our school is also looking for parents that would like to volunteer to become part of the supervision system on the grounds at WRHS. Safety Proctors will conduct rounds every period at each of the proctor stations/areas and immediately report any risk and/or concerns to the appropriate officials. Academic Honor Code for WRHS

As a student at **Wiregrass Ranch High School**, you have entered a community of student scholars and educators who are committed to excellence in education. Take the time to read and think about what you want your education to mean to you. It is assumed that all students will pursue their studies with integrity and honesty. This means that all work for which the student wants to receive a grade, credit or recognition will be the work of the individual student. Academic honesty is a very serious commitment to make so please do not do so lightly.

Students have the responsibility (1) uphold the highest standards of **academic integrity** in the student's own work, (2) refuse to tolerate violations of **academic integrity** in the school community, and (3) foster a high sense of integrity and social responsibility on the part of your class and in the Wiregrass Ranch High School community.

Violations of the following infractions will result in severe disciplinary action by your teacher, which will include – but are not limited to – a grade of F on the assignment/test, a referral, and parental contact. The following are considered egregious infractions of the academic honor code:

I. Cheating

A. Copying, in part or in whole, from someone else's test;

B. Altering or interfering with grading;

C. Using or consulting any of the following during an examination; any sources, consulting with others, use of electronics equipment including cell phones and PDAs, or use of materials not authorized by the instructor; or

D. Committing other acts, which defraud or misrepresent.

II. Plagiarism

A. Incorporating the ideas, words, sentences, paragraphs or parts of another person's writings without giving appropriate credit, and representing the product as your own;

B. Representing another's scholarly works such as written assignments or projects as your own;

C. Submitting a paper purchased from a research or term paper service, including the Internet; or

D. Undocumented Web source usage.

III. Other Specific Examples of Academic Dishonesty

A. Purposely allowing another student to copy from your paper during a test;

B. Giving your homework, written assignments or other academic work to another to plagiarize;

C. Having another person submit any work in your name;

D. Lying to a teacher to improve your grade;

E. Altering a graded work after it has been returned, then submitting the work for re-grading;

F. Stealing tests;

G. Forging signatures of parents or other students on documents; or

H. Collaboration without permission of your teacher



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
