Academic Honor Code for WRHS

As a student at **Wiregrass Ranch High School**, you have entered a community of student scholars and educators who are committed to excellence in education. Take the time to read and think about what you want your education to mean to you. It is assumed that all students will pursue their studies with integrity and honesty. This means that all work for which the student wants to receive a grade, credit or recognition will be the work of the individual student. Academic honesty is a very serious commitment to make, so please do not do so lightly.

Students have the responsibility (1) uphold the highest standards of **academic integrity** in the student's own work, (2) refuse to tolerate violations of **academic integrity** in the school community, and (3) foster a high sense of integrity and social responsibility on the part of your class and

in the Wiregrass Ranch High School community.

Violations of the following infractions will result in severe disciplinary action by your teacher, which will include – but are not limited to – a grade of F on the assignment/test, a referral, and parental contact. The following are considered egregious infractions of the academic honor code: I. Cheating

A. Copying, in part or in whole, from someone else's test;

B. Altering or interfering with grading;

C. Using or consulting any of the following during an examination: any sources, consulting with others, use of electronics equipment including cell phones and PDAs, or use of materials not authorized by the instructor; or

D. Committing other acts, which defraud or misrepresent.

II. Plagiarism

A. Incorporating the ideas, words, sentences, paragraphs or parts of another person's writings without giving appropriate credit, and representing the product as your own;

B. Representing another's scholarly works such as written assignments or projects as your own;

C. Submitting a paper purchased from a research or term paper service, including the Internet; or

D. Undocumented Web source usage.

III. Other Specific Examples of Academic Dishonesty

A. Purposely allowing another student to copy from your paper during a test;

B. Giving your homework, written assignments or other academic work to another to plagiarize;

C. Having another person submit any work in your name;

D. Lying to a teacher to improve your grade;

E. Altering a graded work after it has been returned, then submitting the work for re-grading;

- F. Stealing tests;
- G. Forging signatures of parents or other students on documents; or

H. Collaboration without permission of your teacher

Dress Code Reminder

Parents and students, as warm weather returns, please make sure that you review the dress code policy found in your planner. As a reminder: tank tops, halter tops, or clothing with thin straps (smaller than three inches) are not permissible; hats, bandannas, head coverings are not permitted on campus; low cut blouses are not allowed; sleeveless apparel is not allowed for boys; shorts and skirts should be no shorter than four inches above the knee; tops and shirts must be long enough to remain tucked inside pants or skirts; pants must be worn appropriately. Students that are in violation of the dress code will be given consequences based on the student Code of Conduct.

This has been a great semester so far! The **CNA students** assisted at the elementary school health screenings by checking students' vision, hearing and BMI. The school nurses reported that our students were a HUGE help and vital to the screenings running smoothly. The CNA students also held a blood pressure screening for faculty at WRHS. They are now in the thick of their clinicals at a nursing home working shifts 6:45am – 1:30pm and providing hands on care such as taking vital signs, assisting with meals, toileting and bathing. The hands on experience is invaluable and each of these students are to be commended on their level of professionalism. They represent WRHS extremely well out in the community!

HOSA (Health Occupations Students of America) is in full swing! We have our largest group yet of 68 students registered for the Regional Conference & Competition which will be upon us right after break. It is all day Saturday, Jan 26th at Winter Haven High School. There is a wide variety of events so that students can enrich their learning in a way that uses their strengths. Some events involve giving a speech, writing a paper, performing hands on skills (such as CPR or nurse assisting), making a group presentation, working on a problem solving team or simply taking a test.
