As always, we will continue to use the school connects messages, calls and emails, to remind you of important events. We are hoping that through all of these methods, you will receive information about the happenings at the RANCH! It is critical, this year more than ever, that you have the correct information in our system for communication. Please make sure to complete the electronic emergency cards (information will be available soon).

As summer vacations come to a close, it is now time to start thinking about all of the wonderful opportunities afforded students at WRHS. As you make final plans to return to school, Monday, August 10th, please review all the important information provided on our website and in this newsletter. There were no summer assignments for this year, so we hope that everybody enjoyed the summer and are ready to return rested and ready to learn, whether it is in person or through MySchool online. WRHS will always provide an environment of rigor and relevant curriculum, offering 25 Advanced Placement courses, on campus PHSC Dual Enrollment courses for college credit, plus numerous industry certifications for students in our Business Academy, Academy of Medical Professionals, and our Hospitality and Tourism Academy. It is the goal for WRHS to see each student take a college level course or earn at least one industry certification prior to graduation. Using a 21st century approach to learning, it is possible that students could use some type of technology every day. Students have access to WIFI, use of their own laptops and mobile devices including iPads, smart phones, and other portable devices. With the use of technology comes student responsibility to prevent loss or theft. Students should always secure valuables and not leave them unattended. Be mindful of areas such as the lunchroom, classrooms, and the locker room as these are areas where students tend to carelessly leave valuables unsecured. Keep them locked up or with you at all times.

As you all know, we continue to be overcrowded and have important procedures to help make our school a safe environment and provide a quality experience for all students, parents, and staff. Please continue to review information provided on the website, in this newsletter, on orientation days, and through messages sent by text, email, or telephone. Traffic may enter and exit the school from Mansfield Blvd. at the light, or on Wiregrass Road. The traffic in the student parking lot will remain as is, with traffic flowing into the parking lot on the east side (closest to the building) and out on the west side (closest to the fields). As you enter the parking lot, the **right lane** is for student drop off and the **left lane** is for parking vehicles. Traffic in the morning is always busy, so prepare in advance. With approximately 50 buses arriving, 500 student drivers, 200 employees, and hundreds of parents driving to school, you **MUST** arrive early to prevent being late to school. Entering the campus after 7:10am will lead to students arriving late to class, impacting the quality of learning for everyone. Always follow the posted speed limits of 15 MPH at the entrance and 5 MPH in the parking lot areas. Traffic is **not an excuse** for being late to school. First period begins at 7:24am and all students should be in class at that time. Should you arrive later than 10 minutes to school, do not rush, just walk your child into Student Services and sign him/her in for an excused or unexcused tardy. Unexcused tardies include: missing the bus, sleeping late, alarm clock didn't go off, car problems, etc. For more information on attendance and tardies, please visit that section of this newsletter or the website. Everyone's safety is our number one priority. Arrive EARLY!

The start of the new school year brings with it both excitement, expectations, and several new safety policies and procedures. Please make sure you are familiar with the high school dress code as you make purchases prior to the start of the school year. Review the attendance policy, tardy policy, and code of conduct information with your child. All of this information will be included in this newsletter, on the school website, and on the student's CANVAS page. In addition, please remember that if you come on campus for any reason, you are required to wear a mask and sign in at the FRONT OFFICE. In order to sign in, you must show a photo ID. Visitors will be limited for the first semester and must have an appointment to come on campus.

Throughout first semester there will be many activities and announcements as we adjust to the new normal, please continue to check back to the website for important announcements, dates, and activities. The calendars that are available are a good source of information. Please see information in this newsletter regarding Orientation Days and Open House, as we move to a new format (most will be virtual this year).

Finally, as I mentioned in the beginning of this newsletter, we want parents involved in the school. Please consider joining the PTSA, one of our Music Booster organizations, Athletic Boosters, or SAC. In addition, consider volunteering at the school at least once a month, starting second semester. Tardy Policy

Students will be aware of the 2020-2021 Tardy Policy during the 1st week of school. Information will also be updated on the school website.

Safe Environment Procedures

The start of the new school year brings new safety policies and procedures. Please note the following:

- Prior to coming to school each day, students MUST answer the self-screener questions. If the answer is YES to any question, you MUST stay home. Please refer to screener and other information regarding timelines. This information will be provided on our website prior to the start of school.
- Masks must be worn by all staff, faculty, students and visitors at all times, while on campus. Masks must be in place prior to leaving vehicles.
- Please be aware of your surroundings and adhere to the 6foot social distancing expectations while in the hallways, common areas, and while waiting in lines for any purchases.
- Classrooms will be set up with as much distance between desks as possible to allow for class size. It is important that all students where masks as the 6-foot guideline will not be possible in these areas.
- Restrooms will be stocked with hand soap for use in washing hands. It is important to remember to wash your hands for at least 20 seconds and do it often.
- Hand sanitizer stations will be available in areas that do not have access to running water and hand soap. Each classroom will have hand sanitizer available for student and staff use.
- There will be directional arrows in the hallways to indicate traffic flow and this MUST be followed, to include common entrance/exit doors.
- Visitors to campus **must make an appointment** and complete the COVID-19 self-screener and wear a mask upon entry. Masks must be put on prior to leaving your car.
- If you need to check out your child for an appointment, you must adhere to the **6-foot social distancing guidelines** and no more than 2 people should be in the lobby at any given time. Please remember that you must have a **mask** on.
- The campus will be cleaned and sanitized more frequently throughout the day, especially in high traffic areas and areas with high student interaction, including, but not limited to, wiping down door handles, bathroom sinks and doors, and light switches.
- Common/shared equipment must be wiped down by student using the equipment last (prior to leaving the classroom).
- Students will not be allowed to congregate before or after school hours and MUST be picked up within 30 minutes of dismissal unless they are involved in a supervised activity.

Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS)

We are excited to continue to grow our PBIS this upcoming school year. Last year we recognized over 400 students, faculty, and staff with awards for making and supporting positive behavior on campus. We look forward to seeing everyone, "Take Charge" of their behavior again this upcoming school year.

Dress Code

WRHS administration retains the right to make additional decision regarding the appropriateness of student dress and appearance, and will make the decision whether a student's appearance meets the school and District standards. The Principal's or designee's decision regarding the appropriateness of dress is final.

- Students are not permitted to wear pants, shorts or skirt less than 4" above the knee and are not permitted to wear cut-off, torn, or tattered pants with holes in them that expose skin or undergarments "4" inches above the knee.
- All Pants must be worn securely at the waist.
- No undergarments can be exposed.
- Blouses, shirts, and sweaters cannot dip below a line formed between the right and left armpit. Muscle shirts and tank tops are not permitted. Spaghetti straps, strapless tops, or off the shoulder tops are not acceptable. Tops must be long enough to clearly overlap the belt line, stay tucked in, and not slide off the shoulder during the course of normal movement throughout the school day.
- Pajamas or other costume type attire may not be worn at school unless previously approved by the principal for special school activities.
- Students shall not wear hats or head coverings on the school campus during the regular school day unless

previously approved for medical or religious reasons or special school activities as determined by the principal or her designee.

- Students shall wear shoes for foot protection and hygienic reasons while on school grounds. Slippers are not acceptable.
- Decorations, symbols, mottos, or designs imprinted or attached to the body or clothing which are offensive to good taste or the maintenance of decorum shall not be worn to school or school functions.
- Clothing that advertises tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or identifies them as members of an antisocial group or gang shall not be worn to school or school functions.
- Jewelry shall be worn in a way that does not present a safety or health hazard or cause a major disruption to the educational process. Spiked jewelry, wallet chains or dog collars shall not be permitted.

Consequences:

- 1st Violation: Verbal warning issued by IA or Administrator, and the student will be required to change into appropriate clothing.
- 2nd Violation: Lunch Detention issued by IA or Administrator, and the student will be required to change into appropriate clothing.
- 3rd Violation: After School detention issued by IA or Administrator, and the student will be required to change into appropriate clothing.
- 4th Violation: 3 days After School detention issued by IA or Administrator, and the student will be required to change into appropriate clothing.
- 5th Violation: Saturday School issued by IA or Administrator, and the student will be required to change into appropriate clothing
- 6th + Violation: A referral will be processed for Defiance by IA or Administrator

Portables and Rainy Days

With over 2100 students, we have 30 portables that most students will use during the day. Please plan on providing your child with rain gear or a small umbrella (to fit in book bag) for rainy days. Florida weather is unpredictable and we do not cancel classes in the portables when it rains. Plan accordingly.

Protection of School Instructional Time

The primary purpose of school is to provide instruction for students, and any infringement upon time designated for instructional activities is a failure to achieve that purpose. Therefore, classroom interruptions will be limited to emergency cases only. Please attempt to schedule all appointments after school. If you must check your child out from school, please plan ahead to allow time for a pass to be delivered to the classroom to retrieve your student. Calls to the classroom are prohibited. In addition, teachers will not be checking their email during school hours. Please allow teachers 24 hours to read and then respond to your emails and telephone messages. Deliveries of essential school-related items dropped off to Student Services during school time will be limited to the last five minutes of each class period. We will not be delivering flowers, cakes, balloons, etc. to student classrooms. We appreciate your cooperation, as we attempt to make this the best year yet!

On-Line Classes

Parents and students, please remember to register in advance for all online (Pasco eSchool) classes. Do not wait until school starts on Monday, August 10th. This will enable students to begin course work on the first day.

Parent/Teacher Conference Procedures

The WRHS faculty knows that parental involvement is the number one indicator of student success in school. To ensure a successful parent teacher conference, WRHS asks that the following procedures be followed. Before scheduling a parent teacher conference, please contact and discuss the issue or concern directly with the teacher by email or telephone. If, after this discussion, a face-to-face conference still needs to occur, contact the guidance secretary at 346-6011 in Student Services to schedule the conference. All conferences will be held from 2:00-2:30pm. It is very likely that most conferences will be held through Zoom this year.

Academic Honor Code for WRHS

As a student at **Wiregrass Ranch High School**, you have entered a community of student scholars and educators who are committed to excellence in education. Take the time to read and think about what you want your education to mean to you. It is assumed that all students will pursue their studies with integrity and honesty. This means that all work for which the student wants to receive a grade, credit or recognition will be the work of the individual student. Academic honesty is a very serious commitment to make, so please do not do so lightly.

Students have the responsibility to uphold the highest standards of **academic** integrity in the student's own work, to refuse to tolerate violations of **academic** integrity in the school community, and to foster a high sense of integrity and social responsibility on the part of your class and in the Wiregrass Ranch High School community.

Violations of the following infractions will result in severe disciplinary action by your teacher, which will include – but are not limited to – a grade of F on the assignment/test, a referral, and parental contact. The following are considered egregious infractions of the academic honor code: I. Cheating

- A. Copying, in part or in whole, from someone else's test
- B. Altering or interfering with grading
- C. Using or consulting any of the following during an examination: any sources,
- consulting with others, use of electronics equipment including cell phones and PDAs, or use of materials not authorized by the instructor D. Committing other acts which defraud or misrepresent
- D. Committing other acts which defraud or misrepreser
- II. Plagiarism
 - A. Incorporating the ideas, words, sentences, paragraphs or parts of another person's writings without giving appropriate credit, and representing the product as your own
 - B. Representing another's scholarly works such as written assignments or projects as your own
 - C. Submitting a paper purchased from a research or term paper service, including the Internet
 - D. Undocumented Web source usage
- III. Other Specific Examples of Academic Dishonesty
 - A. Purposely allowing another student to copy from your paper during a test
 - B. Giving your homework, written assignments or other academic work to another to plagiarize
 - C. Having another person submit any work in your name
 - D. Lying to a teacher to improve your grade
 - E. Altering a graded work after it has been returned, then submitting the work for re-grading
 - F. Stealing tests
 - G. Forging signatures of parents or other students on documents
 - H. Collaboration without permission of your teacher.

 - Unexcused absences? Make an appointment with your grade level administrator to develop a plan to make up your time
 - To appeal to be on track: complete the appeal form on the Bulls Pride page of the WRHS website.

- Students must be on track to attend extracurricular events such as homecoming, prom, and Grad Bash
- All freshman students will begin the year on track and remain on track unless privileges are lost

Health News

Parents, please provide annually updated medical histories if your child's medical condition impacts him/her at school. if your child has a chronic medical condition that will require a change to their care plan (due to the current circumstances), please contact the school nurse via email at tkalabal@pasco.k12.fl.us . Just a reminder that students are not permitted to carry any medications except for inhalers, pancreatic enzymes, Epi-pens or diabetic supplies. In order for your child to carry these medications you must fully complete and return the self-carry form annually or your child will not be permitted to carry or administer his/her own medications. This is for the safety of your child and others.. On the first day of school, you will be receiving an emergency card and a healthy student form. Please return these forms ASAP. Medication can be dropped off to the clinic by the parent on the first day of school. All forms you will need are on the district website under the "parents" tab. Scroll down and click on the "student services" link which is listed under "student supports". Do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions or concerns.

SAC (School Advisory Council)

The Media Center welcomes all new and returning students to Wiregrass Ranch High School. All WRHS Sophomores and Freshman will be required to attend a media center orientation the first two weeks of school.

We are excited about the upcoming 2020-2021 school year. We encourage you to stop by the Media Center and look through all the new books we've received! We also encourage you to utilize the Media Center for research, printing, and/or studying. The Media Center is open daily from 7:00am. to 3:00pm. Please note the following information/expectations when visiting the Media Center:

- Eating, drinking, and chewing gum are not allowed
 - A Pass <u>MUST</u> be presented to Media Center staff/peer (without a Pass, you will be asked to leave)
 - Respect each other and avoid distracting or disrupting your fellow users or the Media Center staff
 - All students must sign in and out at the Circulation Desk unless with a teacher/class
- Push in chairs and/or stools
- Clean up any paper, pencils, notebooks, etc. in your work area before you leave
- Computers are to be used for academic purposes only
- There are no student restrooms in the Media Center
- No texting or phone calls

Drivers Education - After Driving Program

After school driving lessons will be offered this coming school year. The cost is \$175 and will provide approximately 4.8 hours of behind the wheel driving. There will be two sessions. Physical Education

Due to the restrictions placed on us from COVID-19, all physical education students will not be issued a PE locker during the **first semester**. We will be providing a room to lock up the student's valuables and we will be making all efforts to keep our classes safe. With that, all weight training students will still be responsible for purchasing a gym towel as we need to wipe down each machine after use. The gym towel can be purchased online for \$4.00. Sanitary wipes and disinfectants will also be available for use before and after a machine is used. Masks or face shields will be mandatory in the weight room. Rules will be outlined by the student's coach during the first week of school.
